Following our Church Council meeting this week, it has been agreed that we will aim (subject to any changes in government guidelines) to have our first service in the building on **Pentecost Sunday, 23rd May**. The service will start at 10:30am and will also be broadcast via Zoom for any who are, as yet, unable to attend. After this, we will aim for **one morning** service and **one evening** service per month through the Summer, and the arrangements will be reviewed at our next Church Council meeting in October. As before, we will need some **extra help** to steward the services, so please get in touch with a member of the leadership team if you are able to serve in this capacity.

Taking a Break. In order to give our local team a break, as well as giving everyone a chance to attend online services from elsewhere, we have decided to take a break from our Zoom worship on **Sunday 25th April**. Services are available from other churches in our Circuit (details in our regular Circuit newsletter), at Sawtry All Saints and elsewhere, and all are encouraged to seek out one of these alternative worship opportunities on this Sunday.
